



## Enjoy Library eBooks on Kindle

1. **Browse** and check out a Kindle Book from CMPL's OverDrive website:  
<http://slc.lib.overdrive.com>
2. **Click** the 'Get for Kindle' button. This opens the Amazon.com website. You may be required to sign in with your Amazon.com account if you are not already logged in.
3. **Select** a Kindle device or Kindle reading app (available for free through your device's app store). Click the 'Get library book' button and sync your device or app to download the book, or choose to send it to your device via USB.

An active Wi-Fi connection is required for wireless delivery to a Kindle device. If your Kindle is not Wi-Fi capable or you do not have an active Wi-Fi connection, please follow Amazon's instructions for transferring files via USB:

## Transferring Kindle Content Via USB

### System Requirements

- **Windows-based:** Windows 2000 or later.
- **Macintosh:** Mac OS X 10.2 or later.
- **USB port:** An available port or an attached USB hub with an available port.

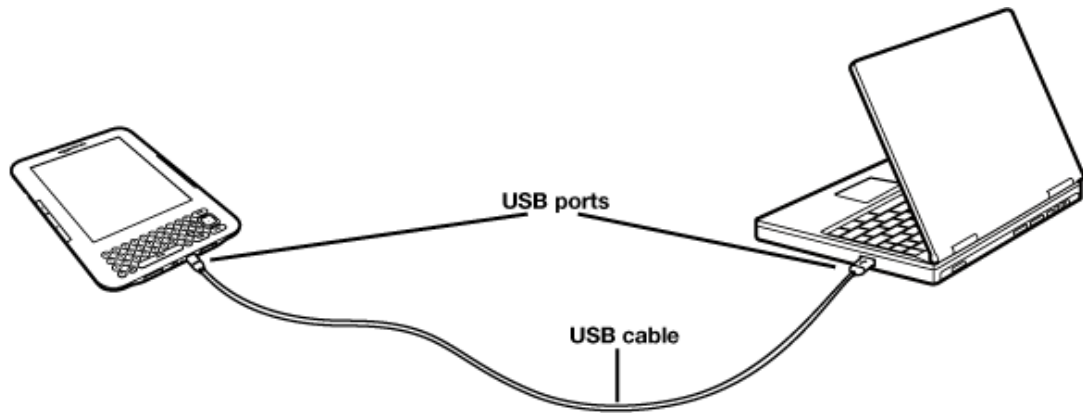
### Downloading Kindle Content

Click the 'Download now' button. You should be prompted to open or save the file; choose "Save" and select a location that is easy to find again, such as the desktop.



Select **Save File**, then click **OK**

Once the file has been saved, connect your Kindle to your computer using the USB cable. Plug the larger end of the USB cable into an available USB port or a powered USB hub connected to your computer, and the smaller end into your Kindle.



When connected to your computer, your Kindle will go into USB drive mode and you won't be able to use the device.

Your Kindle will appear in the same location as external USB drives usually appear. For Windows users, this is typically in the "Computer" or "My Computer" menu. For Mac users, the drive will appear on the desktop.

1. Open the Kindle drive. You will see several folders inside, one of which will be named "documents." This is the folder you will move your downloaded Kindle content into.
2. Locate your downloaded file, and drag and drop it into the correct file.
3. Safely eject your Kindle from your computer then unplug the USB cable. The file you transferred will now appear on your Kindle Home screen.
